
26' - Joel Pepper







Basic Trailering Checklist

Never tow your boat trailer before you check to be sure:

- 1. Coupler, hitch and hitch ball are the same size
- 2. Coupler and safety chains are safely secured to hitch of tow vehicle
- 3. All fasteners are properly tightened
- 4. Boat is securely tied down to trailer (winch line is not a tie down)
- 5. Wheel lug nuts are properly tightened
- 6. Wheel bearings are properly adjusted and maintained
- 7. Load is within maximum load-carrying capacity
- 8. Tires are properly inflated
- 9. All trailer lighting is working properly
- 10. Trailer brakes are properly adjusted and working (if trailer is so equipped)
- 11. Be sure to check <u>local and state requirements</u> regarding brakes and any additional equipment that may be required
